
HAVE YOU SEEN A CHILD LIKE ME?

Pallister-Killian Syndrome

PKS children have very distinct facial features.



Characteristics include: Sparse hair pattern, coarse face with a high forehead, an abnormally wide space between the eyes, a fold of the skin over the inner corner of the eyes, and a broad nasal bridge with a highly arched palate. A diaphragmatic hernia, global delays, loss of muscle tone, and streaks of skin lacking color are often present.
